Treasurer's Report: Rich Arpi reported \$ 1,061 in treasury at start of
the day. Bills to Stew for directory printing (\$ 33.80); Bob Tholkes
for player mailings (\$ 49.78); Dan Levitt for one year T.V. show
registration (\$ 100). John Gregory for Fall Regional (119.97). Since
registration and attendance was 24 paid members and guests
(24 x \$ 5.00 = 120) we broke even. \$ 1,061 figure does not
include bills listed here.

With 4 more people coughing up \$ 10 for newsletter subscriptions,
the list now totals 50.

President Bob Tholkes read the minutes of the last Board meeting of
October 3.

Events: Hot Stove Meeting tentatively set for Saturday, January 15,
1994. Murphy's Landing was mentioned as a possibility. Some
displeasure was voiced about that location. Board will decide on
a site at its next meeting. John Gregory has resigned as Events
Chairman. Vice President Dan Levitt will mull over a possible
replacement.

T.V. Show: Still some space for shows and volunteers despite a listing of topics and dates in newsletter. Some question of how to get tapes to cable access companies. Currently someone has to drive and deliver tape in person to each station. They do not share tapes. Also what to do with Chapter's tapes. Dan Levitt reports about 35 tapes in his possession.

Lexington Park plaque: Rich reports that \$ 273 has been raised so far. Stew hopes to raise enough and get plaque erected in Spring or early Summer 1994.

19th Century Team: Bob Tholkes reported on the sponsorship he has obtained for the team from Murphy's Landing. He has polled members on their interest and availability for games next summer. Earliest game would be in May and latest game around Labor Day. The question was raised on whether women would be allowed to play since we want to be as historically accurate as possible.
