2. Spring Chapter meeting

 - a. Stew Thornley
 - i. Chapter newsletter to be issued soon.
 - ii. Application for Pillbox plaque has more hoops to go through.
 - iii. In the off-season, work continues on documenting rules changes.
 - iv. Will deliver a research presentation at the 19th Century Baseball Conference in April in Cooperstown. Topic is Perry Werden who set a professional record when he hit 45 home while playing for a Minneapolis team in 1895.
 - b. Gene Gomes

- i. Working with Rich Arpi on Excel spreadsheet documenting 19th century baseball in the upper Midwest. Focus is on 1887 season.
 - ii. In 2019, wrote a biography on his great grandfather, Abner Powell, a 19th century pioneer. In a Ginter card set, Topps has included a card on Abner Powell.
- c. Rich Arpi
 - i. Researching St. Paul Globe for game data to include in spreadsheet. May start another season.
 - ii. Research primer page is included in chapter Web site.
 - iii. Working on 1887 Northwestern League season.
 - iv. Possible chapter research project is how baseball was covered by the press in the 19th century.
- d. Terry Bohn
 - i. Continue to spend time working on long-dead minor leaguers.
 - ii. Will review research primer for possible updates.
- e. Glenn Renick
 - i. Working with Jason Schwartz and Mark Armour while partnering with the Hall of Fame on Yuengling ice cream baseball cards issued during prohibition.
- f. Mike Zarling
 - i. Working on project regarding Hall of Fame candidacy. This involves benchmarks and Hall of Famers who don't meet benchmarks. The project involves 24 players per position and 80 pitchers.
- g. Doug Skipper
 - i. Working with Art Mugalian on 2026 Larry Ritter award for best book on dead-ball era. Eight books were nominated and five of the eight are being considered. Award will be announced on April 1st.
- h. Ed Edmonds
 - i. Finished a review of "Baseball in the Roaring '20's" for the NINE conference. The conference is looking for a new site as the hotel where it has been held in the past has closed.
 - ii. Tracking 250 arbitration-eligible players. 30 free agents after the non-tender date.
 - iii. After salary arbitration competition at St. Thomas, three students will compete in New Orleans on January 15-16. Ed will go to New Orleans as a coach. Kris Hard volunteered as a judge in the St. Thomas competition.
- i. Art Mugalian
 - i. George Altman, who passed away in November, was one of three players who played in the Negro Leagues, the major leagues and in Japan. The other two were Larry Doby and Don Newcombe.

Glenn Close
5. This actor won an Academy Award for best supporting actor. One of his earlier movie roles was as a consigliere to a mob boss in a film directed by Francis Ford Coppola.
Robert Duvall
6. In a remake of a heist movie that starred Steve McQueen and Ali MacGraw, this actor acted in the role played by Slim Pickens in the original film.
Richard Farnsworth
7. She has one Academy Award nomination for best actress in a supporting role. For several years, she acted under the last name of Seagull.
Barbara Hershey
8. Generally, cast as a tough guy, he was cast as Mr. Blonde in a Quentin Tarantino film. His sister, Virginia, also acts in Hollywood. He passed away in 2025.
Michael Madsen
9. In a long and versatile career in television and movies, his roles ranged from a newspaper reporter in a short-lived horror series on tv to a buffoonish father in a Christmas movie where he cherished his "leg" lamp.
Darren McGavin
10. This actor won an Academy Award for best director. Two of his most notable roles as an actor were in movies co-starring his actor friend, Paul. He passed away in 2025.
