Opener Draws Big Crowd

The opening day of "Play Ball," the new baseball exhibit at the Minnesota History Center in St. Paul drew a large crowd of baseball fans on Saturday, March 22nd. The exhibit features the collection of area collector Fred Budde as well as some items from the collection of the Minnesota Historical Society. Over the last dozen or so years, Fred has acquired an impressive collection of Twins, Millers and Saints memorabilia, some of which is featured in this exhibit which runs through the end of the World Series in October. Jerseys of Harmon Killebrew, as well as his son's Kenny (remember the father-son games), Rod Carew, Tony Oliva, Kirby Puckett, and (yes Ray), Bert Blyleven are on display. Fred also acquired a Joe Hauser bat, a Pedro Ramos glove, numerous signed baseballs, and Millers, Saints, and Twins signs, pennants and flags. Seats from the old Metropolitan Stadium line the turnstile as you enter the exhibit and there is a small batting cage, that always seems to have a kid practicing his batting.

The day was a rather festive occasion with the Twins organist on hand to provide the proper baseball music and members of the St. Croix, Quickstep and Rochester Rooster vintage base ball teams were on hand, in uniform, to provide atmosphere and to promote their upcoming seasons. Kids also could have their picture taken and make their own bobble-head featuring their own profile. I noticed more than one adult making their own bobble-head. One wonders if they rushed home, logged on to E-Bay, and offered their bobble-head for sale.
