### Book Club

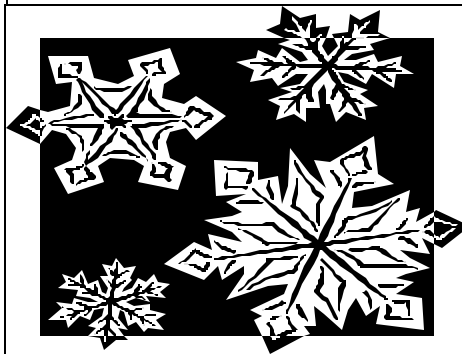

## What is the future of this newsletter?

As was announced in last month's newsletter, I have decided not to seek reappointment for another year as editor of the Holy Cow. Thus this is the last issue I will be editing. The Board of Directors at its December 4th meeting appointed Stew Thornley as editor of the Holy Cow for 2005.

With many people using the internet for online access to information, including this newsletter, having a paper copy becomes increasingly unnecessary. However, we do not want to leave members without internet access out of the information loop, so for the next six months (through June 2005) we will continue sending out paper copies to those members who have paid for it. The future of this newsletter starting with July 2005 is a little less clear. It has been proposed at that time to post only the electronic copy on our chapter website and continue to notify members monthly as

it posted. Members without internet access (currently 22 receiving a paper copy only) could have a chapter friend print out a paper copy for them. Twice a year, members without internet access would get information bulletins listing particulars for chapter meetings and other events through the mail. The national office will reimburse the chapter for these mailings and thus there would be no charge to members.

Part of the reasoning behind this is that an electronic newsletter is not retrained by the two page format. A paper copy is kept at two pages to keep mailing costs affordable. More information can be posted with an electronic newsletter and it requires less work of the editor and his or her office staff. No running to the post office or to Kinko's, or folding, stamping and addressing of the newsletter. Also postage costs are going up.

## Your thoughts are welcome

The Board of Directors recognizes that this is a major change and thus the ultimate decision regarding the paper copy of this newsletter will be made at the chapter Spring meeting on May 21. If you have any thoughts about the newsletter let one of the Board of Directors know or show up at the Spring meeting and express your views.

Stew has agreed to the editorship of the Holy Cow (electronic copy) and sending of the paper copy through June 2005. If members want a separate paper copy (beyond having someone print out a copy from the electronic copy) someone will have to step forward to do the work. National dues have gone up and ways to reduce local chapter expenses and costs to members, while still offering the same information is a worthwhile goal in my opinion.... Rich Arpi
