## Web Site Open to Baseball Writers

In May, Halsey Hall chapter member Tom Swift launched GameDay Daily ([www.mngameday.com](http://www.mngameday.com)), a companion web site to GameDay, the independent program and scorecard sold outside the Metrodome at Minnesota Twins home games.

The site is usually updated at least once each day during the week and at least once during the weekend. The content of the site is focused on the Twins and other baseball topics. Readers have the opportunity to sign up for a free, confidential e-mail alert that announces content updates. One day per week, a baseball card expert and contributor also writes a column. There is usually a baseball book review each week.

Swift said he is open to other possible regular contributors, especially Halsey Hall chapter members who enjoy writing about baseball history as it pertains to the contemporary game.

When the main page comes up, click on the state tourney icon and then on state tournament records. In front of you, you will have all the scores of all the state tournament games, in all classes, arranged by decade, since the start of the tournament in 1924.

The site is well done and contains a number of photographs which add to its attractiveness. This year's state tournament is scheduled in Northfield and Dundas between August 14th and Labor Day.

### Big Inning key for Crusaders

A nine run fourth inning was the key reason the Crusaders from St. Cloud Cathedral beat Breck 12-2 for the Class 2A high school baseball title at Dick Putz Field in St. Cloud on June 13th. The reason this has more significance than any other high school game is that the Crusaders are coached by Halsey Hall Chapter members Bob Karn (head coach) and Jim Karn (sometime assistant coach). St. Cloud Cathedral finished only third in its conference during

the regular season but continued to win during the post-season playoffs to finish the season at 22-6. It was the fifth state title for Bob Karn in 33 years of coaching and Karn's victory total now equals 481 wins.
