Mark Johnson Selected as One of Nine All-Time Twins Fans

Mark Johnson was honored prior to the Twins-Blue Jays game on Friday night, August 11, as one of the team's all-time fans. He was introduced before the game and got to go out to the shortstop position (with each of the other all-time fans taking other positions), where he stood with Cristian Guzman during the national anthems.

Mark was selected on the basis of the essay he submitted, explaining why he felt he was the all-time Twins fan: "I have attended and scored 1,086 Twins games, including 84 percent of the games since our first World Series championship in 1987.

"I remember well the emotions of attending the last Twins game at the Met in 1981 and the excitement of the Twins Metrodome Opener in 1982.

"Winning is great but overrated. Over the years I have especially enjoyed the defensive gems on the field, the well-placed hit, or a choice piece of strategy. Every Twins game is different and exciting."

The Latest from Gos

Glenn Gostick has compiled a list of players, ranking them in terms of their home run dominance. The Dominance Factor (DF) is derived by dividing the at bats per home run of the hitter's peers by the at bats per home run of the hitter. The list covers only players with a minimum of 150 at bats or who are in the Hall of Fame. Not surprisingly, Babe Ruth is at the top of the list with a career Dominance Factor of 8.783 (Ruth's home runs per at bat being 11.763 with that of his peers being 103.314). Cy Williams, with a DF of 4.501, is second. The top current player is Mark McGwire, whose DF is 3.347 (13th on the list). Sammy Sosa, in 66th place, has a DF of 2.377. (Harmon Killebrew has a DF of 2.903, good for 23rd place, just behind Joe DiMaggio, who is just behind Dave Kingman.)

In response to questions from members regarding the newsletter and subscription dues, here's some basic information.
