A Few New (and Old) Members

A native of Philadelphia, Julian Empson "Crash" Loscalzo has been a long-time resident of the Twin Cities and has been involved in baseball in many ways. Julian was the founder of Save the Met, an organization that lived on even though the Met didn't. The Save the Met group rescued the seatback that was the end point of Harmon Killebrew's mammoth 1967 home run and delivered it to the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown. Julian also founded Fans Answer to New Stadium (FANS), which promotes community ownership of the Twins. He also operates Ballpark Tours and ran for commissioner of baseball. Julian—who has been in SABR 15 years and has belonged to the Halsey Hall Chapter in the past—has a wife and three kids. His fan achievements include being present for Hideo Nomo's no-hitter at Coors Field and the first game of the Phillies' 10-game losing streak in 1964.

John Robert McFarland grew up in Oakland City, Indiana, the home of Edd Roush. He has a wife, Helen, two daughters, and two granddaughters, and he plays third base in an old guy's league. John is a retired minister and an author, speaker, and cancer survivor with cancer being the subject of some of his writing and speaking.

<u>Dave Hahn</u> has been a fan of the St. Louis Browns since 1944. He attended his first game the following year and had the chance to watch Pete Gray play. Dave moved to Minneapolis in 1963. He is an Interior Landscape Consultant for Bachman's as well as a sports artist. His work is displayed at the Hall of Fame in St. Louis.

Ian Laurie is a Minneapolis attorney with a vast background in baseball. Ian (pronounced with a long I) was the Twins batboy from 1984 to 1986 (and worked the 1985 All-Star Game at the Metrodome). Marc Hugunin has been a member of SABR since 1985 and a member of the Halsey Hall Chapter in the past. A native of Faribault, he now lives in Stillwater with his wife, Alice. He is a marketing consultant and a member of the Metropolitan Council, appointed by Governor James Janos (a.k.a. Jesse Ventura). He is also on the board of directors of the Parks & Trails Council of Minnesota. Marc was at Jack Kralick's 1962 no-hitter and both of the Minnesota matchups of Kaat and Koufax (Games 2 and 7) in the 1965 World Series. He also listened to Harvey Haddix's 12 perfect innings versus the Braves in 1959. Marc is completing a history and encyclopedia of the Minnesota State High School Basketball Tournaments, boys and girls, all classes, 1913 to present, and is looking for a publisher.

John "Bear" Hagemann, a professor and librarian at the University of South Dakota as well as the president and chairman of the board of directors of the South Dakota Sports Hall of Fame, has been in SABR for about a dozen years. He was, in his words, "a schoolboy first baseman (under the sandlot rubric 'the fat kid plays first base')" and was "infected with Cubs fever at age nine," an affliction from which he has never recovered. The first game he attended was the Phillies vs. Cubs in 1948. More recently, he was present, with his granddaughter, at the Ballpark in Arlington when Kenny Rogers pitched his perfect game. One of the Bear's thrills was a visit with a childhood hero, Mickey Vernon, at a Columbus Clippers game. Originally from Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin, John has been in Vermillion since 1968. He has a wife, Sharyn, four children, and five grandchildren.
